You are an important part of this meeting and need to identify risk and contribute to producing this Plan.

The worries in the assessments and reports for this conference need to be addressed by this plan.

Are the Worries clearly described and specific?

When you read / see the Worries do you immediately understand why this child is subject to this level of Plan?

Are all of the Worries addressed in the Outcomes?

Are the Outcomes child focused?

Are the actions directly related to the Outcome they are under?

Does every action have a clear date?

Does every action have a professional and / or family member who is responsible for this?

Is the Back Up Plan family led? Does it explore the use of extended family and friends?

Is the Back Up Plan specific to the child?

In every core group the Plan must be reviewed and progressed, including making relevant changes to the actions.

There is an expectation at the next ROTH Meeting this Plan will have been developed
