How can we help you

The Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA) service provide independent support for people who have experienced a recent or historic rape or sexual assault and have reported to the police.

- The ISVA Service is independent from the police and other agencies.
- The ISVA Service provides one on one support and is not a counselling service

Your ISVA will liaise on your behalf with all agencies within the criminal justice system and community in order to develop a support plan based on your individual circumstances and needs.

This may require your ISVA to signpost or refer you to services either within First Light or the wider community.

We also provide support to those who have not reported but are considering what they should do. Our ISVAs will discuss with you your options and how these might be best applied to your individual situation.

First Light

First Light is a charity that supports anyone affected by domestic abuse and sexual violence.

Specialist Support

Our ISVA service is open to everyone. Our entire team is dedicated to providing the support you require, and we also offer specialised roles within our team to ensure that expert staff are at your disposal should you require their assistance.

What should I expect?

Referral to the ISVA Service

You will be contacted by our team within 48 hours of receipt of your referral. They will explain more about the ISVA service and confirm your details over the phone.

Support Coordinators

The Support Coordinators will check in with you every 6 to 8 weeks, or less frequently if that's your preference, through an agreed communication method (Text,Email,Telephone or WhatsApp). The Support Coordinators are here for you when you need them, you can contact them between Monday to Friday.

Dedicated ISVA

You'll be assigned a dedicated ISVA when one is available in your area. They will provide continued support, with the option for face-face support, throughout the criminal justice process and accompany you to court if needed.

Trauma Stabilisation Programme.

The Trauma Stabilisation programme offers 3 optional sessions via telephone with our Support Coordinators to discuss onward referrals, emotional support as well as coping and grounding techniques.

Options Meeting

If you have not reported the incident to the Police, you will be offered a total of 3 Options meetings to understand the support that is available to you, as well as support reporting the incident via anonymous information or Police routes.

If you do not wish to report, this does not exclude you from accessing other services such as receiving the self-care booklet, and access into our Trauma Stabilisation programme.

Duty Calls

We also offer ad-hoc calls with a Duty ISVA to answer any questions you may have, and offer support with interviews with the police if you are not yet allocated to an ISVA.
