

Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery

Course Description: This course will support participants understand the issues of human trafficking and modern slavery and their roles and responsibilities to safeguard children. It has been designed to provide participants with an awareness and understanding of contexts and meanings to effectively contribute to safeguarding children from child trafficking and modern slavery. The course will address signs, indicators and effects of human trafficking and modern slavery, practitioner's roles and responsibilities and how to identify and support children affected by it.

Target Group: All staff who may be in contact with children, young people and/or parents/carers who may become aware of possible abuse, neglect, child trafficking or modern slavery. Aimed at individuals and teams with a direct role in working with young people (individually or in a group setting)

Training Level: All levels - additional awareness training

Pre-Requisite Learning: We recommend delegates complete Level 1 Child Protection Awareness training before attending this course

Aims/Objectives:

- Understand what human trafficking and modern slavery is and what is known about it
- Explore how young people become involved in and react to exploitative situations
- Explore factors to determine whether a child is a victim of modern slavery
- Identify local policies and procedures for the referral and assessment of child victims
- Explore risk factors associated to potential child victims of trafficking
- Understand links to other safeguarding issues such as criminal and sexual exploitation and missing children
- Explore issues surrounding child victims who claim asylum

Course Type: Classroom

Length of Course: ½ day

Valid for: One off training. Can be repeated as required
